JOB SUMMARY:

Reporting to the Technical Lead RMNCAH, & Nutrition; the Deputy Technical Lead RMNCAH, and Nutrition will be responsible for the projects goal of increasing Access and Demand for Quality Family Planning, Reproductive Maternal Newborn Child and Adolescent Health, and Nutrition, both at community and health facility level in Kakamega and Kisumu Counties. The Deputy RMNCAHN Technical Lead will jointly with the C/SCHMT, and other Boresha Jamii program officers identify, and support implementation integrated context specific interventions for reproductive, maternal, newborn, child, and adolescent health, and nutrition in line with the needs in the target Sub-Counties, Health facilities and communities. The officer will be **coordinating activities at the County level**, doubling up as the point of contact for Boresha Jamii RMNCAHN related activities. S/he will assume the responsibilities of the RMNCAH, and Nutrition Technical Lead in the absence of the Technical Lead.

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SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

Technical Leadership

Build/Strengthen the capacity of SCHMT and project officers to plan, Budget, finance and provide technical guidance and support for implementation and monitoring of activities across FP/RMNCAH, and Nutrition service delivery areas (Community and Facility), including but not limited to:

- Increasing access to Family planning service delivery including long-term methods.
- Oversee Nutrition interventions working closely with the Nutrition Coordinator.
- Oversee the execution of roles and responsibilities by RMNCAH, & Nutrition Coordinators and program officers to ensure they are aligned to the program objectives.

- Will oversee all RMNCAH Project implementation in the County and support RMNCAH/ PMTCT program implementation in two sub counties in Kakamega County – Lurambi and Ikolomani.


